RE: **OPEN POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT
CIVILIAN CHIEF PILOT**

Please inform the personnel in your division or bureau of the following announcement. This memorandum is to be posted for all employees to review.

Highly responsible and technical position which involves gaining and maintaining an extremely high proficiency level of all assigned cockpit duties. Other duties include assisting all Aviation Unit pilots in ensuring that all aircrafts are operated in a safe and effective manner.

The following are the eligibility requirements:

- Not on disciplinary probation
- Commercial Pilot Rotorcraft – Helicopter
- Instrument Rated Rotorcraft – Helicopter
- 1200 hours Pilot in Command (PIC) for Rotorcraft – Helicopter, with at least 50 hours being in the last 12 months
- At least 100 hours of turbine (Rotorcraft – Helicopter)
- Maintain a Class I or II Airmen Medical Certificate
- All experience must be verifiable

The following items are preferred qualifications:

- Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) with Rotorcraft – Helicopter rating, or MUST obtain this rating within twelve (12) months of appointment to Chief Pilot
- Transport Pilot Certificate (ATP) for Rotorcraft – Helicopter
- Night Vision Goggle (NVG) flight experience
- Law enforcement experience
- Bell 206B/OH-58 experience
